In addition to academically challenging courses, students may participate in Interdisciplinary Cooperative Education (ICE), Project Lead the Way, (PLTW), and vocational programs through the Southern Indiana Career and Technical Center (SICTC). Dual Credit and Advanced Placement courses are open to all students.
